# **Hurricane Season!**

#### Are you prepared?

As the 2018 Hurricane season starts, it is imperative that everyone take a few moments now to ensure their own personal preparedness plans, procedures and supplies are ready, not just for the potential of hurricanes or severe weather but for any emergency.

### **History & Forecast**

The 2018 Atlantic hurricane season forecast calls for the number of named storms and hurricanes to be slightly above historical averages, but less than last year. A total of 14 named storms, seven hurricanes and three major hurricanes are expected this season. This is slightly above the 30-year average of 12 named storms, six hurricanes and two major hurricanes.

#### WHAT TO DO NOW? => PREPARE

- Sign up for warning systems as The Emergency Alert System (EAS) and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)
  Weather Radio also provide emergency alerts.
- Practice going to a safe shelter for high winds, such as a FEMA safe room or ICC 500 storm shelter. The next best protection is a small, interior, windowless room in a sturdy building on the lowest level that is not subject to flooding.
- Gather needed supplies for at least three days. Keep in mind each person's specific needs, including medication. Don't forget the needs of pets.
- Keep important documents in a safe place or create passwordprotected digital copies.
- Protect your property. Remove patio furniture and planters. Install check valves in plumbing to prevent backups. Consider hurricane shutters. Review insurance policies.
